As a result of partnering with Atrium Health, Navicent Health has the opportunity to solidify and grow its position as one of the leading medical centers in the Southeast.

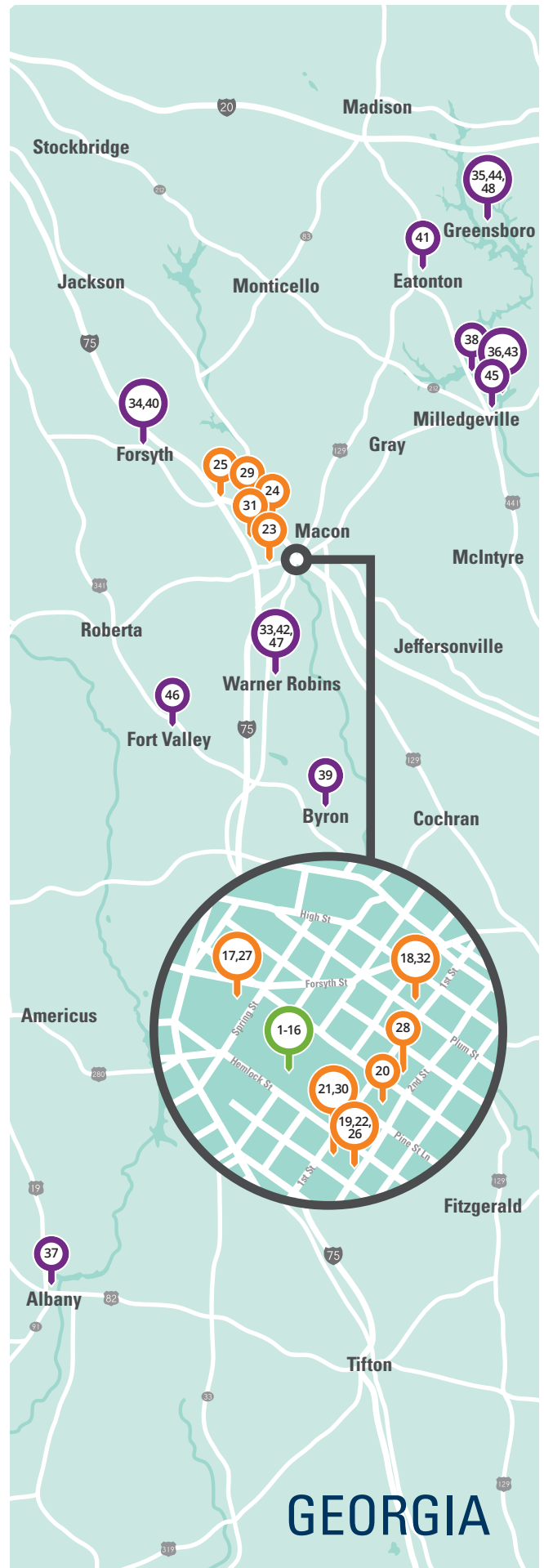

NAVICENT HEALTH SURGEON PERFORMS RARE PEDIATRIC SURGERY

When Mariha and Austin Spencer were five-months pregnant with their daughter Amillia, doctors noticed an abnormality in Amillia's development. She was diagnosed with esophageal atresia – a rare condition in which the esophagus is disconnected from the stomach.

"Esophageal atresia makes it impossible for the baby to eat," said Dr. Josh Glenn, Director of Pediatric Surgery at Navicent Health. "Amillia's case was especially rare, because there was a connection from the upper pouch of her esophagus to her airway, so if she ate, food would go straight into her lungs."

Only 1% of babies with esophageal atresia have this abnormality. When she was born, doctors faced the challenging task of connecting her esophagus to her stomach.

Most of the options for the surgery were highly invasive and came with numerous risks. That's when Dr. Glenn remembered a technique he'd seen during a scientific conference, in which a doctor used magnets to lengthen the esophagus and form a new connection between the tissue.

Dr. Glenn discussed the options with Amillia's parents, and they agreed to try the new procedure. Navicent Health and Dr. Glenn went to work to obtain a Humanitarian Use Device (HUD) exemption from the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

"It's not something we can just order off a shelf like another medical device," he said. "We had to meet several qualifications from the FDA and be approved by our institutional review board because it's still categorized as an experimental device."

Dr. Glenn and the Beverly Knight Olson Children's Hospital successfully acquired the FDA exemption through constant communication with the medical device company and various compliance organizations. Dr. Glenn successfully performed the procedure, inserting the

device into Amillia's esophagus using two catheters, then let the magnets go to work.

"We watched through daily X-rays, and we could see the magnets slowly moving toward each other," he said. "We left them in place until they made the connection. When we removed the device a week later, her esophagus was completely connected."

Amillia's family was thrilled with the results.

"We were excited that the procedure was not very invasive," said Mariha Spencer, Amillia's mother. "It was an amazing feeling, and we were so grateful that we could stay in Macon, right here so close to home."


Today, Amillia is home with her family and making progress in learning how to eat and drink on her own.

This was only the 26th time the procedure was performed in the world and the first time in Georgia. Dr. Glenn says he couldn't have done this without support from everyone at Navicent Health.

"This is a multi-disciplinary task. It didn't happen just because I showed up with an idea," he said. "It took everyone at the hospital working together to try something new."

The procedure serves as a primary example of Navicent Health physicians and surgeons going above and beyond to improve patient care with cutting-edge medical techniques.

"It's important for the community to know that we're committed to moving patient care forward in Central Georgia," said Dr. Glenn. "You don't have to go outside the region to get the best and latest care for your children."



INTENSIVE CARE UNIT EXPANDING AT NAVICENT HEALTH

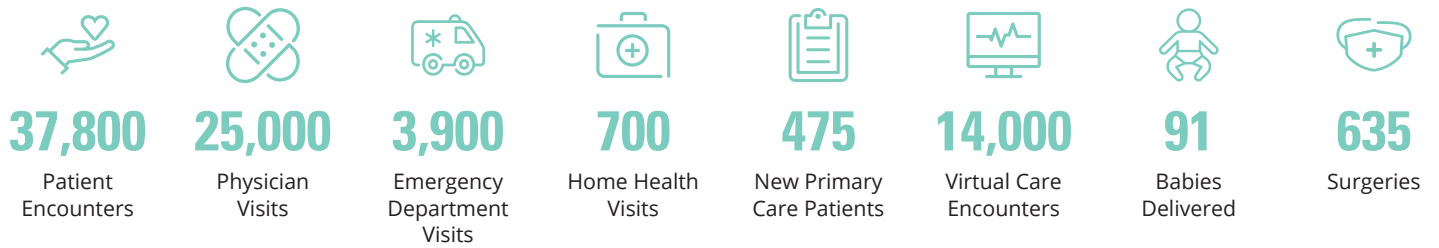

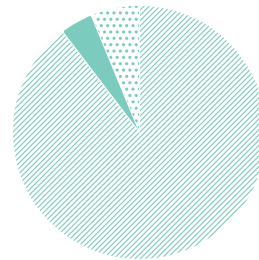

Peyton Anderson Cancer Center Celebrates Milestones

FIVE YEARS OF SERVING CENTRAL GEORGIA

In 2014, the Navicent Health Foundation completed a \$4.5 million capital campaign to build the Peyton Anderson Cancer Center (PACC). Now celebrating its fifth anniversary, PACC continues to provide local and comprehensive cancer care for patients in Central and South Georgia.

ADDITION OF SCOUT TECHNOLOGY AT PACC

PACC became the first hospital in the region to adopt the SCOUT® wire-free radar localization system, an innovative treatment option for breast cancer patients. SCOUT gives doctors the ability to precisely locate tumors, increasing the probability of complete cancer removal and reducing the likelihood of needing follow-up surgeries.

RADIOLOGY TECHNOLOGY ADVANCEMENTS

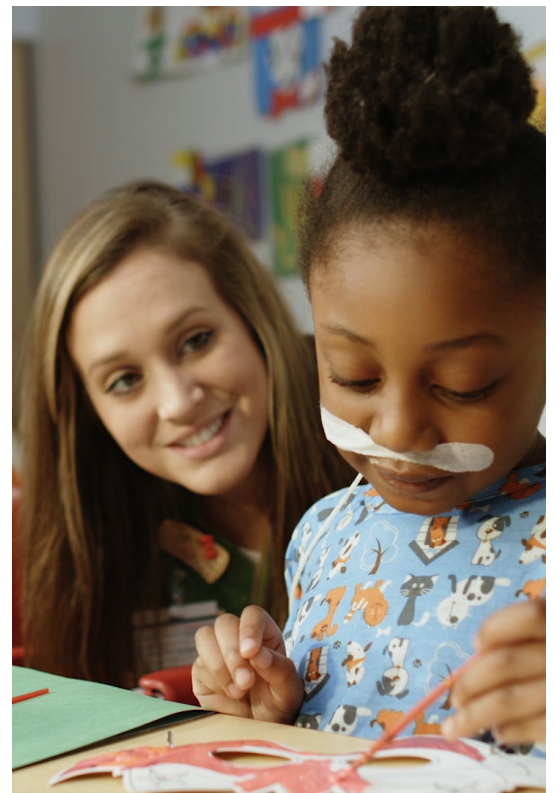
PACC added Intraoperative Radiation Therapy (IORT), an advanced, patient-friendly radiation treatment option for breast cancer patients. This treatment carefully destroys cancer cells and reduces the risk of damage to nearby healthy tissue. Peyton Anderson Cancer Center is the only provider of IORT in Central Georgia.

RECEIVED NINTH CONSECUTIVE AWARD FOR STROKE CARE

MCNH received its ninth consecutive “Get With the Guidelines – Stroke Gold Plus” Quality Achievement Award, an annual award presented by the American Heart Association/American Stroke Association (AHA) for excellence in stroke care.

RE-VERIFIED AS LEVEL I TRAUMA CENTER

MCNH achieved re-verification as an American College of Surgeons (ACS) verified Level I trauma center. MCNH is the only Level I trauma center serving Central and South Georgia, and only one of 24 hospitals in the Southeast to achieve this national recognition.

Walt Thomas has relied on the expertise of cardiologists at Navicent Health for decades. In 1996, surgeons performed a quadruple bypass to clear blockages in his heart. In September 2019, Walt underwent another heart procedure at Navicent Health to insert a stent. As part of his recovery plan, doctors referred Walt to the cardiac rehab program in the Albert Luce Heart Institute.

Three days a week, Walt exercises at the center under the close supervision of Navicent's cardiac experts. He's assigned a personalized workout program based on his cardiac health and progress achievements. The medical staff constantly monitors his blood pressure, heart rate, and more.

The cardiovascular professionals at Cardiopulmonary Rehabilitation, Navicent Health (CRNH) help patients with heart disease reach their optimal level of wellness through education, counseling, and exercise.

“Everyone at the center knows about my specific heart needs. The staff picks up on everything, and they watch my heart carefully. Since starting the cardiac rehab program, I’ve noticed significant improvements in my breathing, and I’m getting stronger every day. PEYTON ANDERSON CANCER CENTER PROVIDES INNOVATIVE TREATMENT OPTIONS

Since its opening in 2014, the Peyton Anderson Cancer Center (PACC) has provided comprehensive cancer care for patients in Central and South Georgia. PACC's experienced physicians and staff are skilled in the prevention, diagnosis, and innovative treatment of all types of cancer.

Delta Goolsby is a proud double cancer survivor. After surviving ovarian cancer in 2015, she was diagnosed with breast cancer in November 2018. Delta visited Dr. Paul Dale at the Peyton Anderson Cancer Center, who performed tests and determined chemotherapy was the best treatment option.

Delta was referred to Dr. Linda Hendricks, a medical oncologist at the PACC. Dr. Hendricks began Delta's bi-weekly chemotherapy treatments in early 2019 and celebrated completion six months later. Instead of following up with radiation treatment, doctors recommended Delta undergo bilateral mastectomies to ensure cancer couldn't return. Thanks to the expert care from doctors at PACC, Delta is proud to be cancer-free!
